Here are a couple Mitzvot from the Rambam's Sefer HaMitzvot, about where we practice the laws first, the house. This should help with five minutes of your Shavuot all night learning.

•Mitzvah 15: Permanently place a Mezuzah. It says, (Devarim 6:9, 11:20), 'And you shall write on the doorposts of the house.' This Mitzvah has caused much anger amongst the parents of the Jewish people. Their kids learn this at school, they come home and destroy the house. They hear to write on the doorposts and they can't wait to get home. I can't tell you how many times I've heard parents reprimanding their children, 'You're killing the door. What are you doing?!... •Mitzvah 214: For the First Year Make Your Wife Happy After the first year, don't try. It won't happen. At that point, complaining about her cooking is suggested. Arguing about the kids is also tradition. You will want to blame her side of the family for anything that's off about the child. Drawing on the doorpost, her side. (Devarim 24:5) 'When a man takes a new wife, he shall not go to the army... for one year, and he shall make is wife whom he has married happy.' It's already enough to try make his new wife happy. We don't want to throw anything else on him, like war. After the first year, get out of the house. Problems start. At that point, you should be hanging out with the boys.
