You're a guest. Be a decent guest. •Bring a Gift You visit Gd and you show up with nothing?! Chutzpah! Bigger Chutzpah is people bring notes nowadays. Notes aren't food. People bring letters to the Kotel. That's not a gift. That's not a Mitzvah. No host needs a postcard from a friend who's looking to get married but can't go out of their way to visit. Hosts want food. You show up to dinner with a dish. You show up with a note that says 'forgive us for not

Shabbat Shalom My Pupils...
(Bamidbar 16:15) 'Moshe got very mad'...
He was dealing with Datan and Aviram. He wasn't even dealing with a board... Why did he get mad? They're rebelling. Kind of like the time Mark skipped vHu Rachum...
'I didn't even take a donkey of theirs, nor have I wronged even one of them.' What did I take from this congregation? Tell me. Other than a few pens... Then why do I have to see Bernie every Shabbis?! What did I do to you people... Rashi explains this to mean that he didn't take anything for himself. I understand, as I have received nothing from this congregation. Not even

a call on my birthday. Not even a decent Chazin. Not a Sefer... I have taken nothing. From Kiddish. Not even a blueberry Danish. But you protest. And for what? What has been taken from you?

You spit. It looks like you're protesting the shul... I understand it's Aleinu. It looks like you're a Korach. It looks like a rebellion... You hocked a loogie... Why spit in shul if it's against idol worship... Spit on an idol. Not on the new carpet...

You know who's stealing from you?! The board. You sponsor Kiddish for a child's graduation. Each of you paid full price.
